Mitt

2 sizes of micro preemie and small preemie, too

needed:

- ✓ dpns or circular needles 2.75 mm (US 2) or size necessary to achieve gauge
- Solve the second se gauge:16 st/20 r = 2" in stockinette

all yarn requirements are approximate shown in Bernat Baby Yarn and Paton's Beehive (variagated)

abbreviations:

k: knit k2tog: knit 2 sts together as one p: purl rnd(s): round(s)

sl X: slip X stitch(es), purlwise and with yarn in back unless otherwise noted st(s): stitch(es)



basic pattern:

cast on 18 (24, 27) st. join to form a circle, being careful not to twist.

- \vee k1, p1. *k2, p1. repeat from * around. end k1. repeat until cuff is 1", $1^{1}/_{4}$ ", $1^{1}/_{2}$ ", or to desired length.
- ∨ k around, increasing 3 sts evenly. (21, 27, 30 sts) slipped rib st pattern: increase 4, (4, 3) sts evenly. (22, 28, 30 sts).
- \vee k around for 1", $1^{1}/_{4}$ ", $1^{1}/_{2}$ ", or until desired length less $1/2^{"}$ for decreases.

if using slipped rib st pattern, end having worked rnd 3.

decreases:

1: k around.

slipped rib st pattern: decrease 1 (1, 0) st evenly. 21, 27, 30 sts

- 2: *k1, k2tog. repeat from * around.
- 3: k around.

finishing:

- ∨ cut 6" tail and thread through remaining loops twice.
- ℽ pull tight. take through inside and secure. Clip.
- \vee weave in all ends.

slipped rib st pattern (2 st repeat): (blue mitts and blue/white mitts)

- 1: *sl1, k1. repeat from * around.
- 2: *k1, p1. repeat from * around.
- 3: k around. for 2-color pattern, work rnd 1 with contrasting colour.)

shadow rib st pattern (3 st repeat): (white mitts)

- 1: (and all odd numbered rnds) k around.
- 2: *p1, k2. repeat from * around.
- 4: k1. *p1, k2. repeat from * around. end k2.
- 6: *k2, p1. repeat from * around.

designer notes:

- \heartsuit cuff of mitt should fit on finger like a finger puppet.
- \heartsuit for perspective, the coin on the mitt in the photo is a quarter and the mitt is the smallest size.
